Halloween Action Alert!

The arrival of Halloween means parties, trick-or-treaters, and lots of delicious candies. However, some of the same goodies and decorations we humans are so fond of can be potentially hazardous to our pets. Here are some common-sense cautions that'll keep your furry friends safe and stress-free this time of year. There'll be no scaredy cats-or dogs-this October 31!

TOP 10 HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS FOR PET PARENTS

- 1. No tricks, no treats: That bowlful of candy is for trick-or-treaters, not for Scruffy and Fluffy. Chocolate in all forms can be very dangerous for dogs and cats, and tin foil and cellophane candy wrappers can be hazardous if swallowed. If you suspect your pet has ingested a potentially dangerous substance, please call your veterinarian or the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435.
- 2. Popular Halloween plants such as pumpkins and decorative corn are considered to be relatively nontoxic, yet they can produce gastrointestinal upset should pets ingest them. Intestinal blockage could even occur if large pieces are ingested.
- 3. Keep wires and cords from electric lights and other decorations out of reach of your pets. If chewed, your pet could experience damage to his mouth from shards of glass or plastic, or receive a possibly life-threatening electrical shock.
- 4. A carved pumpkin certainly is festive, but do exercise extreme caution if you choose to add a candle. Pets can easily knock a lit pumpkin over and cause a fire. Curious kittens especially run the risk of getting burned or singed by candle flames.

This Month's Feature Doggie

Peeta came to us from a court confiscation. Her exact age is unknown as breeding animals seem to age faster, but she is thought to be around 7-9 years old. We do not know if she was born with the leg deformity, or if there was an early injury, but her left rear leg was atrophied, twisted and drawn up under her body. It had not been used for most of her life. She was a three-legged whirl wind! We have now provided her surgery that will hopefully bring her leg back to 80% normal. She still has weeks more of surgery recovery and then physical therapy. We are hopeful. She is tiny at 4.5lbs and loving every minute of her freedom. Although all her life she was contained in a cage, she is very loving and not fearful.

- 5. Dress-up can be a big mess-up for some pets. Please don't put your dog or cat in a costume UNLESS you know he or she loves it (yup, a few pets are real hams!). For pets who prefer their "birthday suits," however, wearing a costume can cause undue stress.
- 6. If you do dress up your pet, make sure the costume isn't annoying or unsafe. It should not constrict the animal's movement or hearing, or impede his ability to breathe or bark. Keep a look out for small, dangling, or easily chewed-off pieces on the costume that your pet could choke on.
- 7. Take a closer look at your pet's costume and make sure it does not obstruct her vision in any way. Even the sweetest animals can get snappy when they can't see.
- 8. All but the most social dogs and cats should be kept in a separate room during peak trick-or-treat visiting hours. Too many strangers can be scary and stressful for pets.
- 9. When opening the door for trick-or-treaters, take care that your cat or dog doesn't dart outside.
- 10. IDs, please! Always make sure your dog or cat has proper

identification. If for any reason your pet escapes and become lost, a collar and tags and/or a microchip increase the chances that he or she will be returned to you.

Please remember keep your pets safe, if you suspect that your pet has ingested a potentially dangerous substance-around Halloween or any time of year-please call your veterinarian or the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center at (888) 426-4435.

How Does Your Dog Food Score?

According to the advertisements, every brand of dog food available is better than the rest. They use pictures of happy, healthy dogs running through the tall grass, or along the beach, and they make it sound as if all we have to do is buy their brand and our dog will live a long and healthy life.

But how do you know for sure, that what you are feeding your dog is really as good for him as the advertiser's claim?

You can grade your dog's food

Start with a score of 100:

- 1) For every lising of "by-product", subtract 10 points
- 2) For every non-specific animal source ("meat" or "poultry", meat, meal or fat) reference, subtract 10 points
- 3) If the food contains BHA, BHT, or ethoxyquin, subtract 10 points
- 4) For every grain "mill run" or non-specific grain source, subtract 5 points

- 5) If the same grain ingredient is used 2 or more times in the first five ingredients (I.e. "ground brown rice", "brewers rice", "rice flour" are all the same grain), subtract 5 points
- 6) If the protein sources are not meat meal and there are less than 2 meats in the top 3 ingredients, subtract 3 points
- 7) If it contains any artificial colorants, subtract 3 points
- 8) If it contains ground corn or whole grain corn, subtract 3points
- 9) If corn is listed in the top 5 ingredients, subtract 2 more points
- 10) If the food contains any animal fat other than fish oil, subtract 2 points
- 11) If lamb is the only animal protein source (unless your dog is allergic to other protein sources), subtract 2 points
- 12) If it contains soy or soybeans, subtract 2 points
- 13) If it contains wheat (unless you know that your dog is not allergic to wheat), subtract 2 points
- 14) If it contains beef (unless you know that your dog is not allergic to beef), subtract 1 point
- 15) If it contains salt, subtract 1 point

Extra Credit:

- 1) If any of the meat sources are organic, add 5 points
- 2) If the food is endorsed by any major breed group or nutritionist, add 5 points
- 3) If the food is baked not extruded, add 5 points
- 4) If the food contains probiotics, add 3 points
- 5) If the food contains fruit, add 3 points
- 6) If the food contains vegetables (NOT corn or other grains), add 3 points
- 7) If the animal sources are hormone-free and antibiotic-free, add 2 points
- 8) If the food contains barley, add 2 points
- 9) If the food contains flax seed oil (not just the seeds), add 2 points
- 10) If the food contains oats or oatmeal, add 1 point
- 11) If the food contains sunflower oil, add 1 point
- 12) For every different specific animal protein source (other than the first one; count "chicken" and "chicken meal" as only one protein source, but "chicken" and "something" as 2 different sources), add 1 point
- 13) If it contains glucosamine and chondroitin, add 1 point
- 14) If the vegetables have been tested for pesticides and are pesticide-free, add 1 point

Score:

94-100+ = A 86-93 = B 78-85 = C 70-77 = D 69 and below = F

try a Halloween treat of a different kind

This delicious recipe was created by husband-and- wife chefs Michael Otsuka and Diane Forley. They are the owners of two dogs and a New York restaurant called Verbena. Here, patrons and their pets may order from the special doggie menu and dine at three café tables in front of the restaurant.

Verbena's Doggie Health Muffins 1/4 cup honey 1/2 cup orange juice 1/3 cup whole eggs 2 tablespoons vegetable oil 1 cup grated vegetables (zucchini, carrots, etc.)

1 3/4 cup whole wheat flour

2 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1 tablespoon wheat germ (optional)

1/4 teaspoon salt

Method

Mix together honey, orange juice, eggs and oil. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients. Add in shredded vegetables. Spoon into prepared muffin tins lined with cupcake wrappers. Bake at 375 degrees.
