Good Games - Bad Games for your Furbabies

Here is the Bad game: "The Catch me if you can game" The dog grabs something and you try to catch him to get it back. (A possessive power trip for the dog, teaches him that he can out-run, out-smart and out-manuever you. Makes him impossible to catch if he ever gets out!

The Good game: "The Hide and Seek Game"

You hide and your dog searches until he finds you. (Teaches the dog to come when called and how to find you when he can't see you)
... or hide a toy or a biscuit and encourage him to find it – an excellent "scenting" game!
(Some times it's just fun)

Fireside Chat

Does your dog like to curl up by the fire? If so, use a fireplace screen to keep your pet safe and warm.

Using a screen and monitoring your dog when in front of the fireplace will help keep your pet's coat and skin from being singed. Be sure he or she stays a reasonable distance away from all heat sources, including fireplaces, wood stoves, and portable space heaters. And before retiring for the evening, completely extinguish all wood and hot coals.



Scent of a Chocolate

Just because they're hidden in wrappers and boxes, don't assume that chocolate confections are inaccessible to your dog.

Chocolate can be poisonous to your dog, even when ingested in small amounts, and your dog can still smell chocolate even if it's hidden in wrappers or packaging. Tuck packaged

treats away so your curious pet can't tear into them when left unsupervised. If you notice any signs of chocolate ingestion — hyperactivity, vomiting, excessive urination, rapid breathing, or the chewed remains of chocolate treats — call your veterinarian immediately.
